




Follow these steps to save files into your repository using SourceTree:

1. Save your file in your local repository, i.e. the directory that you had your repository cloned to on your computer.
2. Notice how that file will be in the “unstaged files” section.




3. Check the file name in “unstaged files” and you’ll see it then be located in “staged files”. Notice how all the lines turn green. This means we’re adding all these lines from this file to your git repository.



4. Write a commit message and make sure that the “push changes immediately to origin/master” is checked. Click on commit and you’ve just added a new file to your repository.
5. After you commit you will notice that the pending files is blank:

6. If you wish to edit your file, save it again locally and start from step 1. This time, when you stage your file you'll either notice green (if you added more lines) or red lines (if you deleted some lines).
